Student-centered approaches that ignite engagement include:

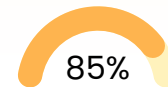
- Use multimodal, active learning strategies

- Integrate game-based activities



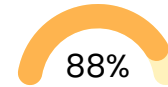
How do educators use Lumio to increase student engagement?

In a user survey of educators, all users across all grades confirmed that they use Lumio™ by SMART to engage students in the learning process.

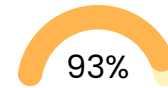

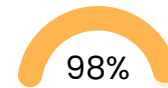
Incorporate ready-made content

Lumio features that help increase student engagement



Whole-class Whiteboards

Activate prior knowledge using a ready-made KWLQ (Know, Want to know, Learned, Questions) graphic organizer.

Elevate student voice through collaborative brainstorming using a ready-made graphic organizer.

Capture student thinking with digital manipulatives.

Reinforce learning with whole-group concept maps or categorization activities.

Support multimodal learning and deepen comprehension using images, diagrams, and sketches.



Shout It Out!

Provide equal, active participation opportunities with open-ended questions for instant brainstorming and discussion.

Create opportunities for safe practice with anonymous student contributions.

Have students share their thoughts on a statement or topic, then categorize responses for discussion.

Prompt students to share one takeaway, question, or connection.

Have students share positive affirmations, gratitude, or responses to “How are you feeling today?”



Game-based Activities

Build student interest and competition with the Monster Quiz or Team Quiz.

Deepen higher-order thinking skills using an opinion-based Rank Order activity to gather student insights and spark class discussions.

Personalize student learning by creating a choice board using a Flip Out activity.

Personalize student practice opportunities by offering multiple games, allowing students to choose the format they prefer.
